## PPG UPDATE

I know we are all feeling totally frustrated in these unprecedented times however there is light on the horizon with the rollout of the Pfizer and now the Oxford/Astra Zeneca vaccines. The Glebe Surgery was one of the first locations in the country to be a Wave 1 site, and it was testament to the hard work by the clinical team, headed up by Dr Keir Newsom, to achieve this goal.

I have personally seen at first hand the long hours the GP's Nurses, Health Care Assistants, Admin and Reception staff are working, from early in the morning to late at night, including week-ends.

We are currently undertaking our 5<sup>th</sup> week of Covid vaccine rollout. Those of you who have already had the vaccine will have seen the marshal volunteers in the surgery car park and how they are helping to keep the process running as smoothly as possible.

The marshal volunteers (all patients at the Glebe) are doing 2 hour shifts from 8.30am to 8.00pm, sometimes in very inclement weather. They have proved to be a small but very significant part in the vaccine rollout process and I would like to personally thank them for their commitment to the cause and for being so accommodating whenever I have asked them to take on extra sessions.

Patients from Henfield, Steyning and Billingshurst have also been vaccinated at the Glebe so my thanks go to the volunteers from Henfield who assisted us when we needed them.

All of this is in addition to the flu clinics which commenced last September and completed in January, ensuring that all over 50's, if they wanted one, had the flu jab.

## SURGERY REQUEST

While we are in the process of undertaking the Covid vaccine rollout, we politely request that you do not contact the surgery by phone, email or e-consult regarding your Covid vaccination. You will be contacted according to the guidelines. We cannot change the priority of who will be vaccinated, but rest assured that we are doing all we can to provide a quick and efficient service to all our patients.

## IMPORTANT REMINDER

Although Covid has high prominence at the moment we must all still be cancer aware.

**It's important to be aware of any unexplained changes to your body, such as blood in your pee or poo, a lump, persistent bloating or pain that does not go away.**

These symptoms are often caused by other, non-cancerous illnesses, but it's important to speak to your GP so they can investigate. Finding cancer early means it's easier to treat.

If your GP suspects cancer, they'll refer you to a specialist.
