

PPG (Patient Participation Group) Briefing Notes August 2024 for Patients' Information

The last PPG meeting was held on Tuesday 25 June 2024 and the following items were discussed:

General Practice Updates

Dr Faye McWilliam will be returning at the beginning of July.

GPs – 3 applicants received for the salaried GP position. Interviews about to take place.

New Surgery Website – 'How can we help' blue banner covers up the photo of the surgery on homepage – could this be moved. Practice Manager will ask for this to be amended.

Referrals to CLC – A meeting was held between the surgery and representatives of CLC regarding Healthy Hearts, a new community project. CLC are looking to run programmes including workshops, activity sessions and interactive sessions – keen to work with surgery to determine what is required.

New Phone system – no recent issues.

A 'Patient Engagement Event' incorporating a 'Carers event' is to be organized later in the year by the surgery. The PPG will assist with the organization as previously undertaken. Date and time yet to be advised.

Staff Car Park Wall - Now repaired. However, a further incident has happened in the Patient Car Park. The Health and Safety Executive were notified of the near miss, which could have resulted in a serious accident. In addition, concerns were raised as to what measures the Landlord is going to take to minimize the risk of any future accidents to the car park walls.

Spring Booster Campaign

Once again, these clinics were well supported by our PPG members and volunteers.

In clinic – 1703

No details yet for Autumn Flu/COVID campaign.

Primary Care Network (PCN) Quarterly Meeting

A PPG member attended a PCN meeting in May held at Henfield Medical Centre, the following items were discussed:-

NHS app – a discussion was held over the fact that there are not enough patients using the NHS app – it was suggested that a 'Forum' be set up to promote this.

Skin Doctor App – this was raised with the PCN as it was felt that it was not an appropriate service for some patients. Photos have to be downloaded on a smart phone and due to the demographic of the Chanctonbury area, a lot of the older patients find it difficult to use. Other surgeries outside of the Chanctonbury Area, do not use this facility, patients are referred direct to a dermatologist. The PCN representative will give feedback to the ICB as this Skin Doctor App is commissioned by them, external and not GP practice funded.

Facilities Management – a proposal was suggested to have one Facilities Manager employed to cover the 4 surgeries – there is no current funding for recruitment to this post but at least it has highlighted the issue. This means any facilities management is still currently being handled in-house.

Other Item

There is no further update regarding the Independent Pharmacy adjacent to the surgery.
